Today, working in early childhood in current times calls for innovative and stronger approaches to appropriately address and meet the needs of children and their families. It also calls for aspirational and dynamic efforts to aptly respond to present realities while aiming to move beyond to successfully prepare children for the future (National Association for the Education of Young Children, 2020). With continuing challenges and rapidly evolving circumstances, teaching and working in early education also demands practices and actions focusing the current, coming needs, and realities of the 21<sup>st</sup> century (McGivney & Winthrop, 2016). This is a time calling early educators to look beyond and deeper for the practices and experiences meeting the needs of children in fresh and responsive ways.

We are seeking manuscripts with a practitioner and reflective focus that explore and address promising practices and policies in early childhood education in the 21st century. We particularly welcome manuscripts about experiences addressing children's developmental needs for a changing time, responsive attention to diversity, and about reimagining early childhood teacher education and development for today and tomorrow. Authors of manuscripts selected for publication in the special issue will be invited to participate in a panel session at the 2025 SECA Conference.

Reimagining early childhood teacher education for today and tomorrow

Reflections on practices supporting children and families' diversities

Preparing educators to work with children in socially challenged communities

Policies and practices: Meeting the diverse needs of children and families in a post-pandemic society

- Manuscripts should be 10-20 pages including references, double-spaced, and follow APA 7th; include supportive references not to exceed 10-12 sources.
