As President of SECA, I have the following ideas that I would implement during my two-year term. To increase membership, I would challenge the leadership from each state to increase their membership by 10% (5% per year). Additionally, I would challenge the leadership from each state to establish 1 new state student chapter at an institution of higher learning (university, college, community college, etc...).

One of the best ways to increase new membership is to offer viable benefits. As the President of SECA, I would establish an ad hoc committee to explore the possibilities of offering a low-cost life insurance policy for all SECA members. This provides a tangible benefit for our "grass roots" members who receive few, if any, employee benefits beyond their salary. Additionally, I would establish an ad hoc committee to explore the addition of "unit materials" to the SECA website. SECA members could download these "unit materials" for their use.

Research shows that one of the most efficient ways to boost membership is through referrals. As a result, it

only makes sense to get our current members involved in spreading the word via a referral program. To encourage our current members to participate, I would propose the incentive of free or reduced SECA annual conference registration for each current member who successfully recruits 5 new members. For the newly recruited members, I would propose a 50% discount for their registration for the annual SECA Conference for their initial membership year. Additionally, all new first year members would be entered into a drawing for full SECA conference registration and a monetary stipend (amount to be determined) for the following year's annual SECA Conference.

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
